



## Hotel Palacio de Prelo

A COSY CHARMING HOTEL IN THE BEAUTIFUL  
ASTURIAN MOUNTAINS

Palacio de Prelo, formerly Miranda Manor House is set in the heart of Parque histórico del Navia, Asturias, between the magnificent mountain range of Sierra de Carondio and nearby preserved Iron Age settlements of Castros de Coaña and Pendia. With its heather covered mountains nearby Boal is not only stunning in colour, it's known as the capital of honey. Miranda Manor House and Prelo Chapel, dating back to the 16th Century, were declared Protected Historical Monuments in 1982 and have undergone extensive and careful restoration and refurbishment over a five-year period to transform it into a cosy hotel offering 3 exclusive rooms and 2 luxury suites. All the rooms have been decorated to the very highest standards and are exquisitely furnished with period antiques and a colourful collection of modern paintings. The South room suite with 2 living rooms is set in the upper floor of the tower, part of the original manor building. From the mezzanine floor within, guests can admire the tower's most unique features: the carved wooden cupola of the pinnacled roof and stupendous views of Navia Valley from the balcony. The North-east room with its original stone interior and 2 balconies overlooks the entrance to the Manor and the Chapel. Two further windows look onto the courtyard garden with its scented plants like camelia, gardenia and jasmine. Palacio de Prelo has 2 spacious lounges on the first floor; one within the Tower itself, and the other with its large fireplace where a roaring fire welcomes you in chilly weather. Guests have access to a PC with Internet, home cinema and billiards. The sitting room is surrounded by wooden galleries which look onto the garden and the chapel and where guests can sit out and enjoy the scenery, read a book from the extensive library or have tea or pre-dinner drinks. Drinks can also be taken on the old wooden settle with its large iron pots and hanging cauldron. Weather-permitting, breakfast can be taken in the gardens - a fusion of Japanese and Arabian landscaping. A lunch menu which consists of the regions' typical dishes, and a carefully selected table d'hôte menu for dinner are designed to amply satisfy guests.
